Focus on Graft Versus Host Disease	
10.15 – 11.00 am	GVHD, patient centred care in the new era - Sara Main (Southampton, UK) <i>Sara will explore graft-versus-host disease as a complex, multi-organ immune condition central to allogeneic transplant care, spanning acute presentation through chronic, fibrotic disease. She will examine its effects across the skin, oral cavity, and internal organs, and outline the escalation of treatment from corticosteroids to advanced immunomodulatory therapies such as ruxolitinib and extracorporeal photopheresis. Through real-world clinical cases, including recognition of GvHD in skin of colour, the session highlights diagnostic nuance, equity in assessment, cumulative treatment burden, and the profound impact on quality of life for patients who may experience prolonged hospitalisation.</i>
11am – 11.45 am	Therapeutic Drug Monitoring in Bone Marrow Transplantation and GVHD - Timothy Vincent (Christchurch Hospital, New Zealand) <i>Therapeutic Drug Monitoring (TDM) is an essential part of delivering safe and effective patient care in transplantation and cellular therapy and graft vs host disease management and is a great example of where nurses and pharmacists need to work together to optimise patient treatment. This session will explain the principles of TDM including when it is utilized and why. Tim will run a collaborative session where we will share and learn from each other using several different examples of TDM used in transplantation and cellular therapy.</i>

This session will present the journey of Frank, navigating his way through an ever-evolving treatment landscape to arrive at 5th line therapy for myeloma. This session will compare efficacy, safety, logistics, and patient suitability, while exploring the unique pharmacy and nursing challenges associated with delivering and supporting these transformative treatments.</i>
